INTRODUCTION

Vision Statement

The *Lafayette Children's Choir of the Lafayette Master Chorale* is an educational and artistic organization dedicated to enriching the intellectual, philosophical, and spiritual quality of life for our community for this and future generations, through the study, practice, and performance of choral music.

4. *Enrich* the lives of singers and audiences by linking them to diverse musical heritages.
5. *Lead* the arts community by creating opportunities to incorporate various art forms in our performances and to collaborate with other arts groups.

THE CHOIRS

Prelude Choir This choir, open to all students in second and third grades, includes those who have a strong desire to sing and are eager to learn vocal technique, sight reading and performance skills. As these children explore their interest in singing, rehearsals will be focused on fun, with singing and movement as the primary guide to building musicianship. Additionally they will gain self-awareness and self-worth within a social structure of sharing musical experiences made lovingly together.

Concert Choir This choir is made up mostly of singers in fourth, fifth, and sixth grades. These singers focus on producing a beautiful tone quality, reading music and singing harmony independently. They will sing challenging, quality musical literature chosen to delight both themselves and their audiences. They must have the maturity to conduct themselves in a professional manner during rehearsal and performance. They must also have high integrity with regard to commitment to their choir.

Youth Chorus The most elite of our choirs, this ensemble consists of our most advanced singers in sixth grade and up. As our top ensemble, the singers in Youth Chorus must have a high level of commitment as they are frequently called upon to sing at outreach concerts within our community. Such opportunities may include performances with the adult Chorale, touring, and singing at important community events.

The Lafayette Master Chorale The Chorale was formed in 1965 and currently consists of 40-60 adult singers from Lafayette, West Lafayette and the surrounding areas. Membership is by audition. Although some of our singers have had formal training, many have not. All are bound by a love of choral music.

REPERTOIRE

The composer Zoltan Kodály once said, “With sweets and candy one cannot rear healthy people. The food of the soul should also be simple and strength-giving. The masters have provided plenty of such nourishment. Feed on this.” At the Lafayette Children’s Choir we, like Zoltan Kodály, believe that children deserve only the best of children’s literature. Therefore the repertoire we choose will be from the long tested folk traditions of ours and other cultures, and artistically composed literature from history’s proven masters (Bach, Mozart, Britten, Copland, etc.).

Though we perform in a variety of venues, including some churches, we are a nonsectarian organization, and it is our commitment to educate our performers and audiences, not to promote or intrude upon the beliefs of our singers and audiences. Therefore, we ask that all singers sing all music presented to them, whether or not it coincides with their personal beliefs. Great care will be taken to ensure that music will be of the highest quality.

VOCAL ASSESSMENTS

All children from second grade up will be invited to participate in one of the choirs of the Lafayette Children’s Choir, regardless of ability level. However, all new singers should plan to attend a vocal assessment to ensure proper placement in one of our choirs. Vocal assessments will be held in August and January of each year. Returning singers will be reassessed each April. The vocal assessment consists of a one-on-one meeting with the director, and it is asked that there be no prepared piece in advance. GENERAL INFORMATION

Please read this handbook for basic information regarding the children’s choir program and expectations. Each singer is required to fill out a [registration information form online](#). At the parent meeting families will also receive a media waiver, emergency contact form, and singer contract that is to be returned in a timely manner at a date chosen by the choir coordinator.

Parents are welcome to observe their child’s rehearsals at any time. However, ***we do require complete silence while observing***. Disruptive siblings (or parents) will be asked to leave. Music and choral folders belong to the Lafayette Children’s Choir. They will be assigned at the beginning of the season and should be used and handled with care. At the close of season, if the folder and/or music are not returned, the singer will be charged a \$50 fee to replace the lost items.

CALENDAR

Choir Calendar/Schedule

Please arrive and check in 10 minutes, but not more than 15 minutes, before rehearsal time in order to go to the restroom, get a drink, find folders, etc.

Special Rehearsals and Performances

Public performances are an important component of the Lafayette Children's Choir. Singers in Prelude Choir, Concert Choir and Youth Chorus will participate in two major concerts this season: a fall concert and a spring concert. In addition, the Concert Choir and Youth Chorus will also participate in the Indiana Voices in Song Festival, which we host every three years. Choristers can only experience the fruits of their labor by participating in the finished product. This opportunity to share their work with an audience in the concert/public setting is extremely valuable. ***Every chorister has a special voice and unique talent to contribute, and everyone is expected to give his or her best!***

The director will select activities and performances for the season. Other community outreach performances may be scheduled based on requests. These will be communicated to the chorister's families at the earliest opportunity. Transportation to all rehearsals and performances is the responsibility of the chorister's parent(s). ***All performances and dress rehearsals are mandatory and if a singer is not in attendance at the dress rehearsal, they will not be allowed to perform; however they will remain a member of the choir.***

MEMBERSHIP AND ATTENDANCE

Attendance Policy

Each choir member holds a very important place in their choir. ***It is expected that rehearsals and performances take a very high priority in each child's life.***

When a child knows in advance of an absence, our choir coordinator, Julie Peretin, info@lafayettechildrenschoir.org, should be notified at least two weeks prior to the missed rehearsal. School conflicts, major religious holidays, illness, and death in the family are considered excused absences. If a member has laryngitis but feels well, he or she is encouraged to attend rehearsal in a listening capacity. School holidays are excused as well, though if you are in town during the holiday we ask that you come to rehearsal. ***There are two absences allowed per semester, including excused absences.*** If there are more than two, a vocal hearing will be required in order to perform in the upcoming concert. Vocal hearings will take place on Monday evenings after rehearsal, prior to the upcoming concert. The purpose of the hearings is to establish readiness. They are not punitive. Dress rehearsals are mandatory. ***Those who have not fulfilled the attendance requirement will not be allowed to sing the concert, but will remain a member of the choir.***

Behavior at rehearsal/performances

Exemplary behavior is expected of all choristers, whether at rehearsals or performances, on stage and off stage. Disruptive and disrespectful behavior will not be tolerated and, after proper warning, will be grounds for dismissal. If a child is asked to leave rehearsal, the parent/guardian will be called to pick up their child at that time. If this happens on two separate occasions, the child will be removed from the Lafayette Children's Choir for the remainder of the year. **Tuition will not be reimbursed.**

Rehearsal Etiquette

Please arrive at rehearsal and check in 10 minutes, but not more than 15 minutes, before rehearsal time. Before entering the rehearsal room, drink water and go to the restroom; once you are in rehearsal, you are asked not to leave again until the rehearsal is over. Upon arrival in the rehearsal room, please have a seat and put your music in rehearsal order. You may talk quietly to your neighbors but not wander around the room until rehearsal has begun. Only water in a closed container is allowed at rehearsal. Please remember that we are guests in the **Grace United Methodist Church** building. Be good representatives of our choir. Running in the hallways and visiting areas that are not ours to use is strictly forbidden. A singer who is waiting for other singers should bring a quiet activity or homework.

Performance Procedures

- Students should arrive 10 minutes prior to call time. **Call times will be announced by the last rehearsal, prior to the dress rehearsal.**
- Students should be well fed, but not overfed, prior to performance. Drink plenty of water the day of the performance and use the restroom prior to arrival.
- Punctuality is imperative. If a child is late to call time, it is possible they will be excluded from the performance.
- In order to sing in the concert, full uniform must be worn. Students should remain in uniform until they leave the performance site.
- We are on stage from the moment we arrive at the facility. Students are to conduct themselves in a professional manner, including speaking in a quiet voice and silence when talking is not allowed. Students should be ever attentive to direction and should walk calmly.
- If a child is feeling ill during the concert, they should quietly sit on the risers in their place, until they feel better. If they still are not feeling well, they should leave the stage and go to our choir coordinator (Julie Peretin) who will wait for their parents in the lobby. Once a child leaves the stage, they may only return at the director's discretion.
- All questions from parents at call time should be asked of our choir coordinator, Julie Peretin. Directors should not be interrupted during rehearsal and prior to performance. The performance is very important to your child and to your child's director, and therefore distractions are to be avoided at all costs.

UNIFORMS

Prelude Choir and Concert Choir

Singers in Prelude Choir and Concert Choir will wear polo shirts and khaki pants (girls can choose either skirt or pants), black socks and black close-toed shoes (no high heels, please). Singers will purchase their own khaki pants and shoes from local retailers. Polo shirts will be provided by the Lafayette Children's Choir.

Youth Chorus

The cost of the uniform is included in tuition and the uniform will be property of the singer.

Girls: Black performance knit top (bell sleeves and cowl neckline) and black palazzo pants with overlay, black, close-toed shoes (no tennis shoes)

Boys: Black dress pants, black collared shirt, black necktie, black socks, black shoes (no tennis shoes)

Personal Appearance

Each chorister is responsible for looking their absolute best and should be dressed appropriately for each performance.

- Earring/facial piercings: studs only, no large dangling loops, gauges, etc
- No necklaces/bracelets
- No giant hair bows, headbands, sparkly/glitter items - all hair accessories should match the color of the hair and be in good taste.
- We ask that singers not wear perfume as it bothers those with allergies (deodorant is okay).

Any chorister that does not come dressed appropriately for a performance will not be allowed to perform.

A uniform appearance for our choir is important. Anything that draws attention toward an individual also draws attention away from our sound.

FINANCIAL MATTERS

A non-refundable tuition payment is due upon registration. If your child is in Prelude Choir or Concert Choir, there is only one tuition price. If your child is in Concert or Youth, it will depend on their uniform needs.

Plan A:

Full year tuition (including full, new uniform cost for Concert Choir and Youth Chorus) is:

- Prelude Choir - \$150 (you must provide your own khaki pants for concerts)
- Concert Choir - \$150 (you must provide your own khaki pants for concerts)
- Youth Chorus - \$220

Plan B:

Full year tuition for Youth Chorus singers who need only ONE new piece for the uniform (shirt OR pants) is:

- \$180
- If a singer needs a new set of suspenders or tie, these can be purchased separately.

Plan C:

Full year tuition for Youth Chorus singers who do NOT need any new uniform pieces is:

- \$150

Lafayette Children's Choir polos are included in the tuition. New shirts will not be purchased for returning singers unless a size change is needed.

Payments can be made quarterly or in full by check or credit card. The first installment of tuition is \$50 and is due at the first rehearsal. If you choose to pay quarterly, you may pay the remaining two equal installments due by the 10th of November and January.

Payments may be mailed to the Lafayette Master Chorale & Children's Choir, (839 Main St., Suite 540, Lafayette, IN, 47901-1403,) or may be given to the Choir Coordinator at rehearsal. Payments can also be made online on our Website under Members Info. If you pay by check, include on each check the chorister's full name. If your check is to be used for more than one chorister or purpose, please attach a note itemizing the charges to be covered. Invoices will be sent at the end of the month to inform you of any past due payments and any upcoming payments.

Payments can also be made online on our Website under Members Info.

No child shall be excluded from participation in a Lafayette Children's Choir due to financial considerations. If for any reason a singer's family is unable to pay the required tuition, they will be asked to fill out a scholarship request form. Scholarship requests will be approved by the Lafayette Master Chorale Board of Directors.

Sibling Discounts

If more than one child participates from within a family, \$25 will be deducted per child, for each additional child's tuition.

Recruiting Discount

Singers who invite a friend to join, and their friend completes a full season, will receive a \$25 discount the following year.

Plan A

The payment plan would be as follows for Prelude, Concert (full uniform needed), and Youth (full uniform needed):

Season Ticket Offer: Replacing the special ticket offer for parents from previous seasons, we now offer a season ticket package to all of our patrons. For the discounted price of \$18, patrons can purchase season tickets for both of the 2021/2021 LCC concerts. This is a \$20 value. In addition, season ticket holders have exclusive reserved up-front seating available to them. As always, children up to the age of 18 are admitted free to concerts with a ticketed adult.
